Programme Outcomes

1. The MPhil programme in the Department has been designed to train the students with Masters degree, theoretically and methodologically, and prepare them for PhD programme. They are trained to use secondary and primary data and information and the archival material in research. They are trained to formulate research designs and taught application of theories and concepts in production of theses. An elaborate training is given to conceptualize secondary literature, e.g., books, reports and research articles, and build ideas and perceptions by interlinking and critiquing the various shades of existing arguments and discourses. The students in this programme are also trained to articulate their thoughts on various social issues and do seminar presentation. The writing of dissertation, which every student has to do, is a real training for formulation of research proposals, and application of the class-room teaching in production of research documents, based on secondary and first-hand material collected through fieldwork. Most students carry on further research on the same field in producing their PhD theses.

Programme Specific Outcomes

1. The Department was late in introducing the MPhil programme. It has so far produced only one MPhil, who is now pursuing her PhD and teaching in the Law Department of North Bengal University. Currently five other students are doing MPhil, either doing coursework or writing dissertation. After completion of MPhil they will join the PhD programme in the Department. The students write research paper and present papers in seminars.
